



Calvary Homes continues to be committed to the ongoing safety and health of all our residents and team members as we all deal with the COVID-19 virus and as the flu season begins.

All of our residents continue to be COVID free.

When conducting our weekly COVID testing for our health care team members last week 3 team members came back with a positive test. Those team members had no symptoms at the time of testing. The team members are being quarantine for 14 days. We have determined that the exposure to our health care residents was very low. Two of our team members work on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of our health care center. All POA's &/or a family member is being contacted about the positive test. The other team member had minimal exposure to health care and personal care residents.

Our health care residents on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of health care are still in quarantine due to our last week's team member's positive test and possible exposure to our health care residents. We are requiring any team member that goes into a resident's room to wear full Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

All residents and team members will continue to be tested on a weekly basis.

Our personal care centers continue in Step 3 of the Governor's "Re-opening Plan". All visits are being scheduled by appointment only and will be held inside due to the colder weather. Residents are allowed one 30 minute visit per week. Our residents in Health Care and Personal Care continue to be monitored twice on a daily basis for any symptoms that may be related to the virus. In-room visitation restrictions continue to be in place with the exception for those at end-of-life situations. If there is something you would like to get to your loved

one or friend you can drop it off at the front office at the Hurter Center main entrance. One of our team members will be happy to deliver it to them.

For our residents living in our main building apartments (Cathedral Hall, Hamilton, Nissley & Hurter) inside visits continue to be allowed. Please remember to keep 6' physically distanced and each person should be wearing facemasks covering their nose and mouth during their visits. All visitors are required to enter through our main lobby, fill out our screening form and have their temperature taken when they come and leave. They are to go directly to the resident's apartment and not stop in any common areas, gift shop or café.

We remind all of our team members of the infection controls & prevention plans that we have in place and have been trained on. All of our team members go through a screening process, have their temperature taken and are evaluated to make sure they are well enough to work as they come for each shift. We are also taking the temperature of our employees as they leave work as per guidance from the PA Department of Health.

We understand that communicating and seeing your loved one is important and we continue to offer ways to get you connected through video communications with the use of Facetime, Skype, or Facebook.
