



Calvary Homes continues to be committed to the ongoing safety and health of all our residents and team members as we all deal with the COVID-19 virus. All our team members continue to follow all infection control procedures.

The positivity rate in Lancaster County continues to go up. On 9/7/2021 the CDC website shows that the positivity rate went from 8.8% to 9.9%.

On September 7, 2021, during routine testing, a team member tested positive for COVID-19 and is self-isolating at home. All appropriate precautions have been initiated and outbreak testing will be conducted per regulatory requirements. Additional precautions initiated include, but are not limited to:

- The Upper-level and Lower-level of our Health Care Center and Nissley Personal Care Center are under quarantine.
- **All indoor** visitation is suspended, excepted for approved compassionate care visits. - Group activities and communal dining are suspended in all three areas.
- Outside appointments for residents under quarantine will be reviewed and rescheduled if appropriate.

We are testing Health Care and Personal Care team members, fully vaccinated and not fully vaccinated, on a weekly basis. There have been no additional team members that have been positive.

All Health Care and Personal Care residents are being tested. All Health Care residents were negative.

Personal Care residents are presently being tested and the results have not come back as of this posting.

This will be updated when the results have been received.

Current mitigating action to prevent or reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission include but are not limited to:

*Visitors restricted to essential personnel or services and compassionate care visits/end-of-life visitation after successful symptom screening completed and required education provided.

*Symptom screening for team members before scheduled shift

*Universal masking for all employees and use of personal protective equipment (PPE), including eye protection with each resident encounter

*Employees are social distancing and performing frequent hand hygiene

*Residents are social distancing and are assisted with performing frequent hand hygiene

*Active symptoms screening for all residents, masking when in the presence of others or when receiving care (as tolerated), limited movement outside of their rooms, and modified dining and Life Enrichment programs to eliminate group gatherings

*Residents admitted from the hospital or other levels of care admit to a designated area and are on contact & droplet precautions x 14 days.

*Implementation of universal COVID-19 screening testing for residents and employees

*Implementation of red, yellow, and green zones for cohorting residents.

Due to the increase in the positivity rate and in following the recommendations of the CDC and the PA Department of Health, all Cottage and Rohrer Apartment residents as well as all visitors and guest must wear masks upon entering all of our main building (Cathedral Hall, Hamilton, Nissley, Hurter Community & Administration Center including the apartments, Baumgartner & Nissley Personal Care Centers and Bausman Health Care Center). All residents living in the main building need to be wearing masks whenever that are out of their rooms or apartments.

We continue to offer a variety of ways you can communicate with your loved ones whether you are able or not able to visit them.
